

#### THE HERMAN AND EVA BLUM ENDOWED AWARD

Dr. David Blum '72 WSU School of Medicine, and his wife Marie '71 WSU School of Library Science, hereby establish the Herman and Eva Blum Endowed Award. Herman and Eva Blum were Jewish survivors of the Holocaust. They met in a displaced persons camp in Bamberg, Germany after World War II. Both had lost their spouses and all but one of their children. They married in 1946 and started a new family. In 1949, they immigrated to the USA arriving in Detroit, Michigan on July 4th 1949. Life was difficult, but in spite of poverty, all three of their children, Esther, Rose and David, became college educated and successful. Herman and Eva Blum believed that education was a major avenue for becoming free from poverty and to provide the means to always help the poor, the sick, the weak, and the downtrodden regardless of race, ethnicity, gender or religion. This annual community service award, in their memory, is to be given to the senior medical student who best represents these principles in thought, and most importantly, in actions.

#### HERBERT MENDELSON ENTHUSIASM FOR MEDICINE ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Dr. Herbert Mendelson is committed to excellence in patient care. He believes in the art of medicine and that patients should be better after seeing the doctor, regardless of the treatment provided. He emphasizes humanity, humility, humor and always going the extra mile to make a difference. Above all, he believes that physicians should maintain their enthusiasm. This award is given to the student whose enthusiasm, dedication and passion for the field of medicine and for helping others embodies the ideals of Dr. Herbert Mendelson.

#### THE LEONARD TOW HUMANISM IN MEDICINE AWARD

Presented to both a senior student and a faculty member who best demonstrate outstanding compassion in the delivery of care, respect for patients and families and their fellow colleagues, as well as clinical excellence.
